We are periodically maintaining contact with the point person for the Palm Beach Lakes congregation to determine when, or if the service of being a hub for Hurricane Dorian supplies will continue. Of course, the funds are not bottomless. But the plan is to keep working until they run out!

We DO have the 5 gallon water bottles and with about 3 pallets left, along with reusable grocery bags, we have some things to keep us busy in the upcoming month as the country opens up for normal business.
