This newsletter closes 2020! This year will be long remembered in history's record. As the year closes we take comfort in the absolute truth Habakkuk pondered long ago. The stress of trying to reconcile God's righteousness permitting an evil society, was a battle for the prophet's faith. But faith persevered as the Almighty's assurance of divine justice's inevitability was accepted. Dear brother and sisters!

Cordial greetings and kind wishes to you for 2021! We wish you perseverance and trust in the Lord in our joint worshipping Him and proclaiming the truth of His Word. May He build up our hope and fill His children with wisdom, health, joy, and peace.

Big thanks to you, our American friends, for your prayers, warm and encouraging support, your love and care that you show through the aid you provide for us here in Ukraine.

Those who worshipped online with us still join us, none has dropped out. We have one more family now that came from Zhytomyr. Both husband and wife are disabled. Besides, Marina's aunt Olya and her husband Misha join us online now."

One more month, the month of December, flew by like one day. One more year is almost over and we are coming even closer to eternity.

We continue our ministry at Church, in the city and villages.

Despite of all the attacks on the part of God's adversary – illnesses, lockdowns, which are canceled and then reinforced again, - we still have our in-person services, following all safety rules.

We studied the Book of Revelation on Sundays where the Lord through John comforts first-century Christians and shows them the wonderful things awaiting those who will remain faithful to the end.

On Wednesdays we studied the Epistle of James.

Friday is a prayer day when we pray for the needs of God's people.

Saturday is a day of visitations.

After Sunday worship, we go to the village to encourage new Christians. We work with local people there and come back home Monday evening.

Our visiting brother Gif preached a very good and encouraging sermon. Anya translated for him and did a great job.

All brothers are actively involved in different ministries and wait at the Lord's table.

Ruslan takes care of the needy and elderly members bringing food and medicines to them whenever need be. Together with Andrew, Pavlo and Kolya he helps at the construction site doing minor building works. They look after the storage facility for humanitarian shipments.

Ruslan is the Director of our online Bible School that has 4 students enrolled at this point.

By God's grace none of the members have been badly ill, though some have contracted the virus. Some members are unable to worship in-person so they join us online. Those who worshipped online with us still join us, none has dropped out. We have one more family now that came from Zhytomyr. Both husband and wife are disabled. Besides, Marina's aunt Olya and her husband Misha join us online now.

As far as steady numbers in the congregation, we have 50 total that attend when COVID restrictions allow and there are 20 more that are open to the Church. A complete lockdown because of the virus is planned in January – January 8 through 24. We pray for the Lord to protect His children both in Ukraine and America from any deadly harm that this virus presents.

We meet with people, preach to them and give out Bibles to those who are willing to read.

We help needy families in villages, such as large families as well as orphans and poor ones. There are 7 boys in one family. Another family has 5 children, 4 boys, mother passed away. We brought lots of clothes, shoes, toys and food to them. These children live in poor conditions but they don't murmur at God. They believe and pray. They pray for us and for you, dear brothers and sisters. We told them about you, and the Church in America that loves us even though we are so far away from one another. We read children's Bible together and talk about the Lord.

A NOTE FROM GIF...

Hello there! Just wanted to pass along some thoughts and updates from visiting the Church here.

First, yesterday's worship was a great time and Ivan is doing a good job preaching through Revelation. I spent most of the day after with him and Andrew because they wanted to practice English. Apparently the two of them have been working together on it as a hobby. Ivan is actually getting quite good; he needed Anya to translate some of my responses but for the most part he was able to speak his own sentences. Andrew has improved but is shy to use it. I asked Andrew why he had decided to learn it and he said "I want to talk to my American brothers." I think that encompasses the heart that he has! It was nice to spend some time with them. Also, after the worship service, Svitislav and Daniel got up and recited Psalms 1 and 23. They did great! Svitislav is quite the English speaker now too and has taken a great interest in learning jokes so he is my new favorite person here. Also, Ruslan gave the thoughts before the Lord's Supper and the contribution and the comments were really good. Specifically, he said that when it comes to contribution for the church building, we appreciate what Americans have done for us but we need to make this our own and make sacrifices for ourselves, and not be so reliant upon American help. He said several other things along the same vein, and I thought it was very wise and well put.

Today, we went out to the construction site and it has come a long, long way since last year! I was curious as to how they intended for their older/disabled members to make the trip out that far away from the city. Andrew said that there is a bus route now and the city is planning to run a trolley in a few years.

Ivan and Sveta are really quite passionate about Zelena. Every conversation we have had for the last couple of weeks, they bring it up somehow and talk about it at great length. They have been going there almost weekly to conduct studies and classes since the pandemic started. Currently, the Christians there are joining the Ivano-Frankivsk services through phones each week as they have no transportation here and no one there really able to preach.

Please let me know if you need me to do anything else while I am here for the next few days. Supposedly the first container will arrive tomorrow and I am planning to go help unload. Of course, they initially planned on it being here December 23, so...here is hoping someone actually meant January 5 when they wrote that. But anything else you would like done here after that, I am open to it and have a willing translator.

During December, I had total expenses of \$11,092.14 charged to the Ukraine Mission account. Ukraine Expenses: Salaries in Ukraine (\$500.00); Taxes in Ukraine (\$90.00); UA Office (\$50.00); Help to orphans & widows (\$600.00). USA Expenses: Shipping Cost, Supplies, Moving (\$4,117.62); Personal reimbursements (expenses; salary; insurances) (\$5,419.72); Unreimbursed Mileage (\$114.80); Utilities for warehouse (\$200.00).
