Baptism!!!

First, it is hard to believe that the first month in 2025 has already passed. The best news is that we have a new brother in Christ, Mike Williams (pictured below). He was baptized January 16. He has an interesting story. Early in life he was a heavy drinker, but a few years ago he realized what that was doing to him and determined to stop. He became involved in Bible study and worship and believe that it was Jesus who helped him overcome that addiction. He came to Littleton seven years ago to get away from the crowd he had been running with and for additional support to remain sober. Although he had been involved in church and Bible study down south, when he moved here, he had not found a “church home.”



A few months ago, he saw my business card about the church on the bulletin board at the gym. He sent me an e-mail giving me his phone number. I called him, we got together for Chinese food, and he has been worshipping

with us ever since. We began one-on-one studies with him and he learned that what he had believed before was not what the Bible teaches.

Through the short time we have lived here we have had contact with several men and women who have struggled with alcohol addiction. It is amazing how many of these people Mike knows. This town is small enough that these men and women know each other as they have put forth an effort to overcome their addiction. We believe that he can help us reach others who have and continue to struggle with alcohol addiction. Even before he was baptized, he was reaching out to them and encouraging them to come worship with us. We believe that God can use him! Many of these people have reached a point in their lives where they have come to the conclusion, “There has to be something better!” Jesus is who they need!!!



Evangelism in 2025

We plan to continue sending *House-to-House – Heart-to-Heart* to the 1,600 homes in Littleton every other month. The cost for this is about \$620 each month. We plan to put door hangers on every door in Littleton this year. These hangers will have information about the church in Littleton – when and where we meet. As we are doing this, we plan to talk to as many people as possible to give them a personal invitation.

We are also planning to have another public seminar sometime during the year. The theme will be “Coping with the Struggles of Life.” With the ads, we will list several particular struggles that will be discussed in the seminar.

I still go to the hospital everyday and visit all the patients. I have had several very good conversations in which I am able to sow the seed of the kingdom.

Help Coming

As we mentioned in the last Support Report, Remy and Mia Bullis, a young couple, are making plans to come work with our team. They are hoping to be here by May or June. If you can support them, please contact me for details as to how you can do that.

Last year we had ten students from the University of Arkansas (Razorbacks for Christ) who came and did twelve service projects in the community. We are excited that they are returning. They will not only do service projects but also put door-hangers on lots of doors. Justus Bobo is a Bear Valley graduate and is their campus minister.

Monday for the Master

One of the evangelistic ideas that came out of our meeting is a program called “Monday for the Master.” The idea is for the Christians who are available on Mondays to devote two or three hours each Monday evangelizing. The Senior Center where we meet each Sunday for worship, serves a meal every day for anyone who wants to come eat. Those of us who can attend plan to eat lunch there every Monday to get acquainted with those who attend and then come to the house to work for the Master for another two or three hours.

We did this for the first time, January 27. We got there at noon but found that most people began gathering between 10:30 and 11:30, so all the tables were full and we didn’t get to meet many others. Those in charge seated us at a table by ourselves, but soon a homeless lady who has been worshipping with us for several weeks came in and sat at our table and she brought a man, who is also homeless to sit at our table. It was ideal. The lady has been staying in a homeless shelter, but even then, she has to leave the shelter at 7:00 a.m. and can’t return until 7:00 p.m. The man she brought lives in a tent in the woods. (Can you imagine sleeping in a tent outside when it is 14 degrees below zero)?

We learned that he had been a successful handyman and supported himself very well. The lady he worked for lost all her money through a scam so she couldn’t hire him anymore. About that time Covid hit and he couldn’t work at all. Gradually, he lost everything he had, including most of his tools. We are in the process of helping him. We hope through his efforts and our help, sometime in the future, he will get “back on feet” financially. His name is Michael. Please pray for him and our effort to help him.

After that meeting, we came back to the house and sent out about 30 hand-written-letters to prospects from my prospect list inviting them to worship with us. We also had a special prayer for Michael. We plan to have some special prayer sessions on our Mondays for the Master. Please join us in prayer for these special efforts of evangelism.

We plan to eat at the center every Monday and then come to the house to work on some project(s) to help us reach out into the community. Please pray for that effort. One of the activities we are going to do in the next couple of weeks is to write thank-you notes and include a Dunkin Donuts gift card to the twenty-five people who work in the Littleton police department. This will include all of the staff as well as the police officers. I have gotten names of all of them so that we can express appreciation to each by name. We realize that God gives the increase, but we want to do our part in sowing the seed and watering it.

On a Personal Note

Weezie and I are doing well for a couple who are in their 80s. Thanks for your prayers for our health. We thank God everyday for the strength He gives us. We are especially thankful for the financial support you give that enables us to do this work. We love what we get to do!!

For those who have been keeping up with the saga of our house remodeling – we now have a deck on the house and they are to start the rest of the work soon. Thank God!
