At this time last year, we were just settling back in from summer travels and eager to share the work for the last quarter, July—September. Similarly, we are excited to introduce to you our newest convert:

## *Antwanique*

This makes the third baptism for the year. You may recall the mention of Antwanique in a previous report. She was studying, but not quite ready for the changes that naturally follow becoming a Christian. She is now a twelfth-grader, and made the decision with full knowledge of the commitment required of her. One challenge is that she is the daughter of a member, but lives in a home where her father is not a Christian. This choice, with parents on different sides, was mature and she has been strong.

She has always been helpful, quiet, attentive, and has had a positive attitude. Neke, as we call her, has been coming to Polishing the Pulpit for the past few years with her mom and has come to love the preachers there and the camaraderie of the saints on such a large scale.



We are hopeful that this change will impact her father, who is now outnumbered in their small family 2:1. The choice of his only child and beloved daughter will be an additional encouragement for him to choose the Narrow Way. Shameika reports that Neke is involved in the Ladies Class and is such an attentive student in Bible classes. As a senior, there are a few short months before she is on her own, so we hope to encourage her to deepen her faith as she prepares for college.

All in all though, each meeting is full of good discussion, tons of Scripture and his interest is all in. I am hopeful he will impress the need to continue the studies despite the busy nature of his life.

Though we have had conversions, we have had some inconsistency in people remaining strong. To date, we have fifteen souls in the congregation, but we need prayers for strength as well as growth in the last quarter of 2025.
